CRITERION VII: INNOVATIONS AND BEST PRACTICES

- **Caring:** The College through its various associations has been always providing financial benefits to needy students. This year in wake of increased fees structure of Panjab University, the **Old Student Association** of the college contributed **Rs. 457697** benefitting **196** students. In total the scholarships worth **Rs. 3371437** were given to **1246** students that greatly helped them.
