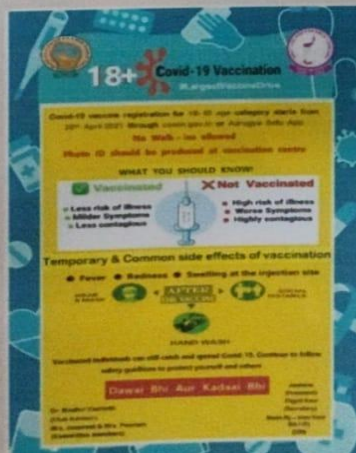
COVID AWARENESS WEEK

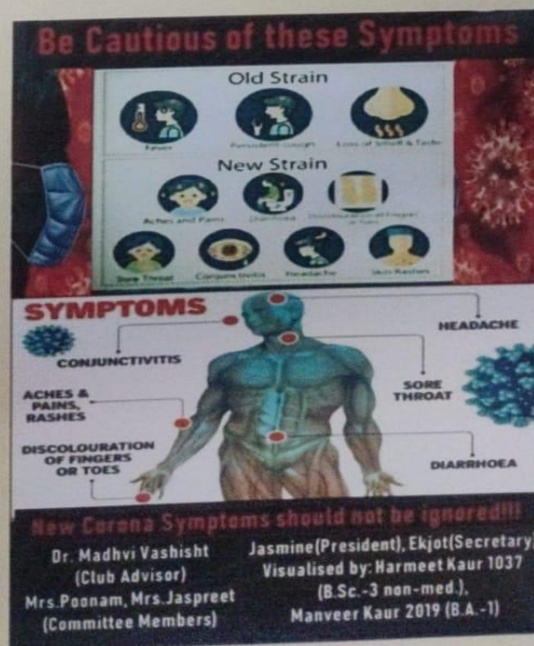

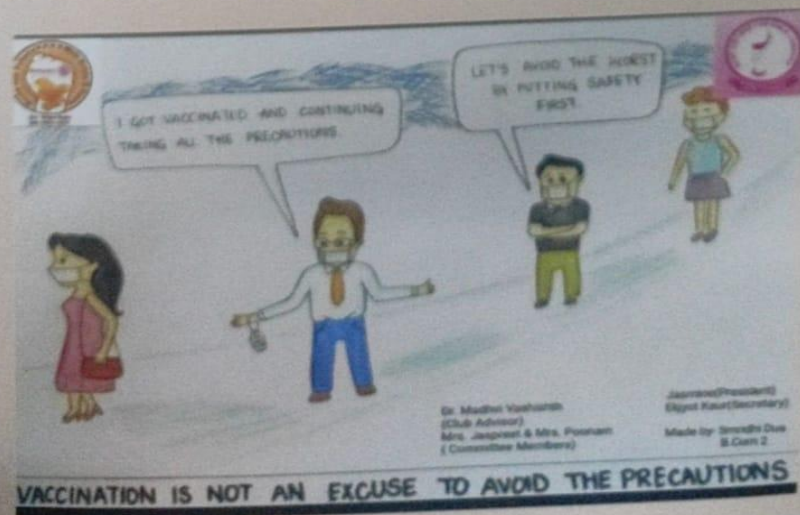

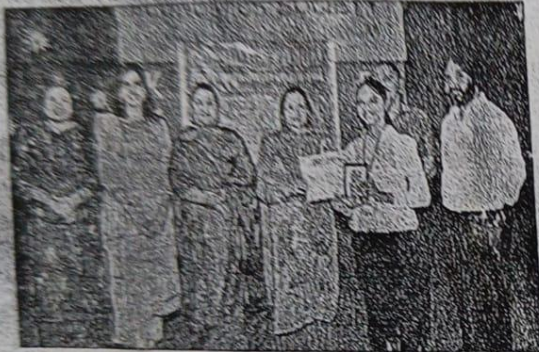
LUDHIANA: New India Insurance Company Celebrated 'integrity- a view of life' at Government College for Girls, under the aegis of principal

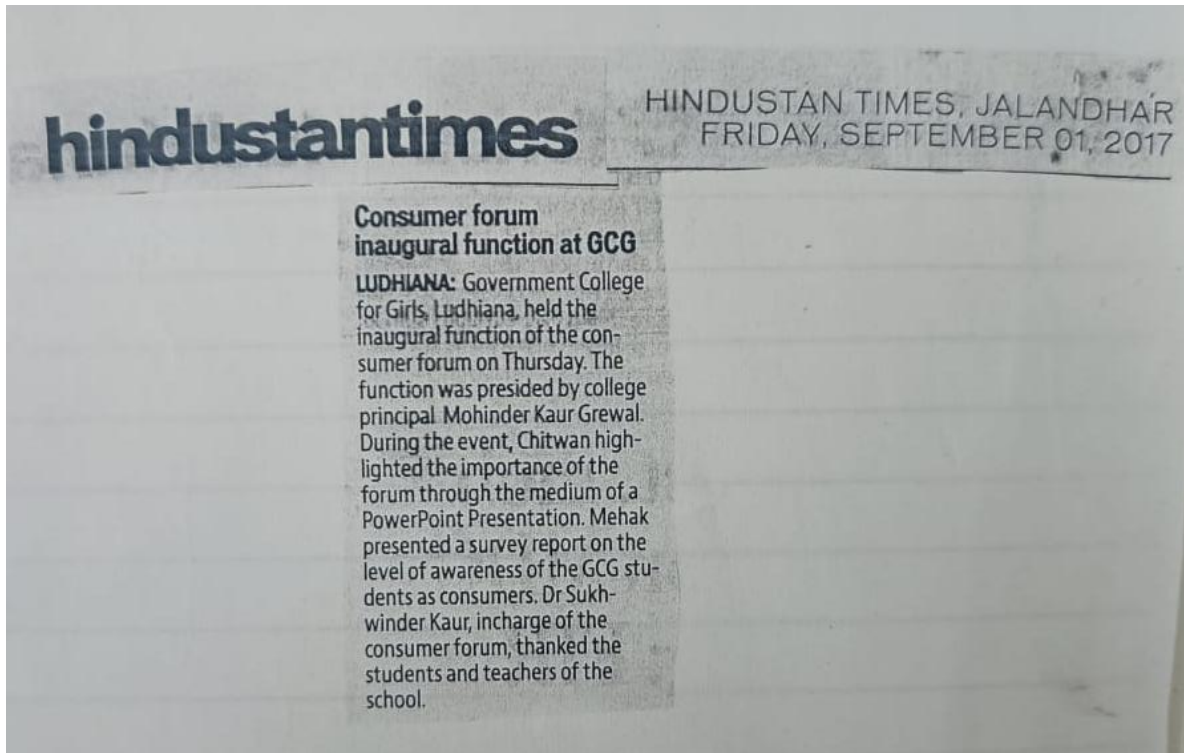
