The placement cell has been taking rapid strides in the field of career counseling. A Campus placement drive was conducted by IBM Daksh on Jan 2009. About 90 girls participated in it and 23 girls were issued campus placement letters. On Oct 2009 mass counseling programme was organized in collaboration with Employment Generation and Training Deptt, Govt. of Punjab. Campus Recruitment for the post of PO in JMG- Scale I was conducted by Corporation Bank on Nov. 2009. 34 students applied for the same and 13 were shortlisted and 3 were selected. On Nov. 2009

Pool Campus Recruitment Drive by Wipro Technologies, Bangalore was held at Guru Nanak Institute of Management and Technology, Gujjarkhan Campus. 37 students of our college participated. 


