The outcomes during the session 2020-21 were reviewed and plans for the next session 2021-22 were discussed.

Review of the outcomes for the session 2020-21:

1. Due to Covid-19 Pandemic and lockdown, comparatively lesser physical activities could be organized at college but still various societies conducted online activities like poster making, Shayari competition, Nukkad natak etc.
2. College started their visibility on social media via its YouTube channel. During the academic year, college actively initiated and promoted its activities on YouTube channel in order to reach to its students. Also, college Facebook handle has become more active in taking its activities to its students.
3. E-content have been generated by GCG Faculty to make teaching more effective accommodating various Audio-visual aids.
4. Two faculty development programs have been conducted online with regard to Research Methodology and Wellness

5. Amidst Covid 19, college strengthened its IT Infrastructure wherein amount worth 31 Lakhs was spent to upgrade 21 classrooms to Smart classrooms. Also, labs were augmented with modern tools and equipment.
6. In addition to this approximately Rs. 6.5 lakhs were spent on repair and maintenance of college infrastructure.
7. In order to encourage Industry-Academia interface, college undertook pilot project with Gryphon Consultants, that worked on imparting soft skills training like communication skills, aptitude, mock interviews and alike to senior classes of college.
8. With regard to RUSA grant, administration ensured effective utilization of same as many as new instruments (worth Rs. 4 lacs) have been added to psychology labs. Out of Rs.33 lakhs, nearly 16 lakhs have been given to PWD for underground water supply, air-conditioning of college auditorium and seminar hall.
9. In order to promote research environment in college, an International FDP on Research Methodology was organized and it was a huge success. Also, many research papers got published in national and International Journal. In addition to this E-content of Dr. Jaspreet Kaur got recognition from SWAYAM e-portal and IIT, Madras.
10. An MOU has been signed by the college where GCG has become regional center along with Mahindra college, Patiala for Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University, Patiala.
11. Proper SOPs have been followed keeping in mind Corona situation so as to have Corona free campus.
12. A classroom has been renovated and is in complete working condition for current batches of B.Voc Global Professional in Beauty and Aesthetics.
13. In addition to all this, college has been aggressively working towards Holistic development of its employees and students, wherein, half an hour Fitness break has been introduced for all.

After reviewing the outcomes of the present session, plans for the next session 2021-22 were proposed:

- 1 Continuing with holistic development, it is proposed that the college should create a Meditation Centre, Acupressure Park and Open Gym for taking care of the needs to strengthen physical and mental health of all the stakeholders.
- 2 It is proposed to set up Skill Development Centre under Punjab Government Initiative in order to bridge gap between Industry and academics. Various venues have been proposed for the same.
- 3 Proposal was made by Prof. Ashwani Bhalla to collaborate with private training centres like Vardhman, Hero Cycles, Punjab and Sind bank in the city in order to promote Skill development in college.
- 4 Incubation Centre for promotion of startup has been proposed wherein final year can work on their business idea under mentorship of faculty members and can check feasibility of same. Students from economically weaker sections can be given training on various skills under same proposal so that they can take any future challenges ahead.
- 5 Keeping in mind NEP-2020, blended mode of education – Online and offline both need to be strengthened in order to have better teacher-student interaction. For this it is proposed to sensitize the faculty members to adopt various learning management platforms like Zoom, Microsoft Team, Google classrooms and many more.

- 6 According to Dr. Inderjeet Singh Sidhu, lots of challenges are faced by Government colleges especially in terms of teachers' motivation. So, college management must play an effective role with regard to same.
- 7 Awareness regarding government scholarship should be done on social media platforms so as to effectively deliver same to concerned students.
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
